Jana jana kā hove bhalā, jana jana kā upakāra.

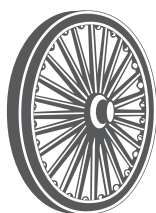
***May the Ganges of the Dhamma keep flowing in the world,
